ORDINANCE NO. 1235

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF AVALON, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1214, SECTION I REQUIRING OWNERS AND TENANTS OF PROPERTY ABUTTING ON PUBLIC STREETS IN THE BOROUGH OF AVALON TO REMOVE DIRT, RUBBISH, SNOW AND ICE FROM THE SIDEWALKS IN FRONT OF THEIR PROPERTIES.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Avalon, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

SECTION I. Whereas Section I shall be amended to read as follows:

"It shall be the duty of every person or persons being the owners or tenants of any property abutting on the public streets of the Borough of Avalon to remove any and all dirt or rubbish which may from any cause accumulate on the sidewalks on which the said property abuts, within forty-eight hours of receiving notice to remove the same; and it shall be the further duty of such owners or tenants to remove from such sidewalks within twenty-four (24) hours after the accumulation thereof, all snow and ice from the sidewalks on which said property abuts. Any failure on the part of the owners or tenants to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction before the District Magistrate, be subject to a penalty of not less than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, nor more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for each offense. Each day after the expiration of the notice to remove dirt or rubbish, or after the twenty-four hours following any deposit of snow or ice upon such sidewalks, shall be taken and deemed to be a new violation of this ordinance."

SECTION II. Any Ordinance or part of an Ordinance inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
