RESOLUTION NO. 818

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE KEYSTONE RECREATION
PARK AND CONSERVATION FUND

WHEREAS, man's most precious and indispensable possession is the earth's natural resources and his most critical duty is to curb and eliminate pollution and waste of the bountiful and beautiful land with which our Commonwealth and County have been blessed; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania General Assembly has approved placing a question on the November, 1993 election ballot requesting the approval of the electorate to borrow \$50 million, over a three-year period, for grants for the Keystone Recreation Park and Conservation Fund, the assets to be applied for acquisition of, improvements to, and rehabilitation of parks, recreational and educational facilities, historical sites, zoos and public libraries; and

WHEREAS, during the second year, and thereafter, 15 percent of the state's share of the Realty Transfer Tax revenues will be deposited into this fund to ensure that this worthy program continues; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, under this program, shall provide grants of bond revenues and realty transfer tax revenues to municipalities, including counties, to fund up to 50% of the eligible project costs for rehabilitation and development of outdoor and indoor recreation and park facilities and to pay up to 50% of the eligible project costs for the

acquisition of recreation and park lands, greenways and natural

areas; and


WHEREAS, the State Department of Education shall provide grants from bond revenues and realty transfer tax revenues to pay up to 50% of eligible project costs for planning, acquisition, development and rehabilitation of public libraries; and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the

Borough of Avalon does hereby commend the Pennsylvania General Assembly for its wisdom in approving the question for the November, 1993 General Election; and, we favorably urge our citizens to vote in favor of this referendum to improve our parks, recreational and educational facilities, historic sites, zoos and public libraries for the perpetual benefit and enjoyment of all of our citizens.


