OFFICIAL RESOLUTION NO. 893

A RESOLUTION OF AVALON BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF AVALON FORMALLY ACCEPTING THE RESIGNATION OF COUNCILPERSON JOHN STERLING IN THE THIRD WARD OF THE BOROUGH OF AVALON AND APPOINTING A SUCCESSOR COUNCILPERSON.

WHEREAS, John Sterling, a Councilman for the Third Ward of the Borough of Avalon located in Allegheny County has resigned said position effective May 15, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Avalon accepted said resignation on May 21, 1998; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the acceptance of the resignation of Councilman John Sterling, a vacancy on Borough Council now exists in the Third Ward of the Borough of Avalon; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 53 P.S. § 45901 of the Borough Code, it is the responsibility of the Borough Council to fill such vacancy within 30 days; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has selected Daniel Sefick to fill the term of office left vacant by the resignation of John Sterling in the Third Ward of the Borough of Avalon; and

WHEREAS, said individual Daniel Sefick meets the requirements set forth in the Borough Code, and is thus eligible to fill said vacancy in that he is a registered voter of the Third Ward; and


WHEREAS, said individual has resided in the Third Ward continuously for at least one year prior to this date.


NOW THEN, in consideration of the aforesaid, be it resolved by the Borough Council of the Borough of Avalon that Daniel Sefick is hereby appointed as Councilperson of the Borough of Avalon representing the Third Ward until the 1st Monday in January after the first municipal election occurring more than sixty (60) days after the vacancy occurred at which election an eligible person shall be elected to the office for the remainder of the term.
